Subject: Retiree Update—Great News!! Illinois Supreme Court reverses lower court holding that the “benefits of participation” clause only protects “pensions”.

Dear Retirees,

We haven't completed our reading of the case, (it's attached to this email),

But here's the conclusion of the Kanerva decision rendered just this morning on the state retirees' healthcare case:

For the foregoing reasons, we conclude that the State's provision of health insurance premium subsidies for retirees is a benefit of membership in a pension or retirement system within the meaning of article XIII, section 5, of the Illinois Constitution, and the General Assembly was precluded from diminishing or impairing that benefit for those employees, annuitants, and survivors whose rights were governed by the version of section 10 of the Group Insurance Act that was in effect prior to the enactment of Public Act 97-695. Accordingly, the circuit court erred in dismissing plaintiffs' claims that Public Act 97-695 is void and unenforceable under article XIII, section 5.

¶58 Our holding that plaintiffs are entitled to proceed on their pension protection clause claims obviates the need to address the sufficiency of their remaining claims. Because plaintiffs have obtained all the relief that they seek, any comment on their other claims would be advisory and in conflict with traditional principles of judicial restraint. See *In re Alfred H.H.*, 233 Ill. 2d 345, 351 (2009) (recognizing that Illinois courts generally do not consider issues where the outcome will not be affected, regardless of how those issues are decided).

¶59 The judgment of the circuit court of Sangamon County is reversed, and the cause is remanded for further proceedings.

This is terrific for us, we'll bring this to the federal court of appeals, and ask to now let us proceed ahead!

Happy Fourth of July! I love this holiday, because, to me, it is the essential story of freedom.

Today's decision similarly may restore some of our concerns that the system needs to be repeatedly pressed, like all of us, to comply with the law.

We'll have more after we've reviewed the case further, but I wanted you all to learn of this great development as soon as possible.

I wish to thank those who responded to my piece in the April newsletter. Some comments were positive, others not so much. I hope those disagreeing took time to contact their elected officials. Someone compared me to Rush Limbaugh. While I know the name, I have never listened to his program. Someone inferred that I might be a Republican, Tea Party member, and even, heaven forbid, a Catholic. Actually, I vote for, and encourage others to vote for the best person they think can represent us honestly. One writer suggested I apologize. I have nothing to apologize for; there still is that 1st amendment thing and people can disagree.

When an individual chooses a live style such as vegan, military, gay, religious (priest, nun, minister), naturalist, medical profession, politician, police or fire, etc., they must accept both positives and negatives of their choice. It is not appropriate or just for them to change the rules for everyone because of their opinions, feelings, customs or beliefs.

In Illinois and other states pension issues are a great concern. In Chicago, the Labor Union and the Municipal Workers Union caved into to Mayor Rahm Emanuel's demands. Their reason, it seems, was that the Mayor threatened to privatize their jobs. There are cases pending before the Illinois Supreme Court because pension benefits have been reduced in violation

of the Illinois Constitution. Injunctions have been issued to prevent the reduction of benefits from be initiated and are pending rulings of the Illinois Supreme Court. Many believe that there will not be pension legislation until after the November elections.

The Korshak/Underwood Medical issues are still undecided. If you forwarded you email address with a contribution to Attorney Clint Krislov, he emailed you an update. Recently, there was a favorable decision from the Illinois Supreme Court relative to the Sangamon County case. They stated that health benefits are a benefit in a pension or retirement system. This is a big win for us, but the battle is not over. Also, we had two other favorable decisions, one from the Illinois Appellate Court regarding the CTA, and another from the Arizona Supreme Court.

Illinois elections are this November and this is the only newsletter before then. The choices for Illinois governor are radically different, yet both seem to have ties to Chicago Mayor Rahm Emanuel, which is not good for our retirees. Please stay current on what they are doing and hope the media presents an accurate portrayal of their intentions.

Judges in Illinois are up for election and/or retention. If you vote for a judge, find out about them. The papers publish the recommendations from several attorney associations. You can take these papers into the polling booth. Please remember on a retention ballot, **IF YOU DO NOT VOTE FOR A JUDGE, IT IS A VOTE FOR THEM.** A judge needs 60 % of YES votes to retain their position. So you **MUST** vote NO to keep them from retaining their position. If you don't vote, and their friends or party vote yes, then they are a shoe in.

When a person runs for office their previous actions, life style, and decisions reflect their positions. The best indicator of future behavior is past behavior. *Percy Bysshe Shelley* said, "Power, like a desolating pestilence, pollutes whatever it touches." Good people often compromise their values when they need votes to get re-elected.

One of our members contacted us and said that members should be given a vote. I believe the last time we had a contested election was about 8 years ago. Sending ballots to all members would cost about \$15,000. That is not tenable. Recently, there have been discussions about the voting procedure with the new Board. We are hoping something will be worked out. I went through our membership list and was able to determine that we have 4,473 who reside in Illinois; 2,585 in Chicago. I included the numbers from each state in this newsletter.

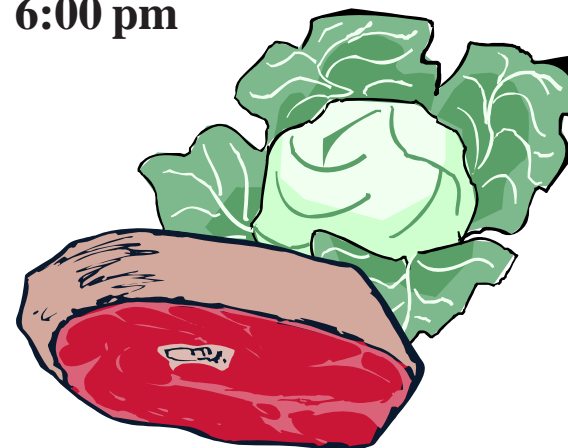

Retirees First Time IROCC Applications

Those of you retirees who are applying for your IROCC permit for the first time, there has been a change in the initial process.
